FOR USERS OF OUR HORSE ARENAS

We use GENAN ULTRA COARSE rubber granulate as top layer. A top layer of recycled rubber granulate provides a resilient, shock-absorbing surface, offering less strain to joints and tendons – and reducing hoof wear. And should you fall off, the elastic rubber layer will ensure a softer landing.

PROPER CONDUCT WHEN USING A HORSE ARENA WITH RUBBER GRANULATE

Rubber granulate must stay inside the horse arena to avoid dispersal to surroundings. Good habits to show when using the horse arenas are thus the following:

- Brush rubber granules off the horse's leg boots and bandages on the paved / tiled area when you leave the arena. Sweep granules back inside the arena afterwards.
- 2. Use a horse manure fork to pick up droppings, if any, in the arena. Lower the underside of the fork into a bucket of water placed inside the arena. Rubber granules are loosened and will stay in the bucket. Empty the bucket in the arena when full. Do not throw rubber granules onto the manure heap.
- 3. If rubber granules are found on the horse's equipment back in the stable aisle, sweep them up and throw them into the waste bin.
